

Council has reassigned our current CEO Dwayne Nashkawa to the position of Strategic Advisor and will advertise for a new CEO in the near future. The new CEO will manage day-to-day affairs and oversee the administration of our nation’s programs and services. The role of Strategic Advisor will be to focus exclusively on strategy, higher-level issues and opportunities, supporting the Chief in managing external relationships and acting as a political advisor to Council.

Once the new CEO is hired, Dwayne will support the transition and step away from the day-to-day management of operations to focus on this important new role. Council believes this change will strengthen the overall administration and governance of our nation by improving our capacity to deliver quality services to members, and by exploring new opportunities that support our nation’s growth to benefit our membership now and in future generations.
